## **Key facts about brain injury**

A brain injury can affect anyone, at any time and can instantly alter the course of life.

Every year, approximately 350,000 individuals are hospitalised in the UK due to an acquired brain injury - that's one person every 90 seconds.

That's almost 1,000 individuals daily – enough to fill 13 double-decker buses.

An acquired brain injury (ABI) is an injury sustained to the brain after birth that can profoundly impact vital functions like walking, talking, thinking, and feeling, often resulting in severe and permanent losses.

The effects of brain injury are extremely varied and can include psychical, cognitive, social and emotional changes. These hidden effects often fluctuate and are widely misunderstood.

## Over the course of the next parliament around 1.8 million people will be admitted to hospital with an acquired brain injury.

Urgent government action is needed to improve the lives of those currently affected by brain injuries, as well as those who will be affected in the future.
