• Brain injury rehabilitation

Ethos:

• Empowering people, together, honest, outstanding, support.

Costs (per week):

• Current base fee £1958.64 with the option of additional bespoke therapy

Clientele:

• People with acquired brain injuries, age ranges from 20-65

Location:

• Fitton Street, Nuneaton, Warwickshire

Family Accommodation:

• There is not family accommodation on site, but families are welcome to visit the unit as often as they would like.

Family Dining Facilities:

• The unit has an open plan dining room and spacious garden with benches provided, that can be used to support family dining.

Range of Cares Provided:

 Promoting independence, support with enablement, planning, budgeting, social skills, independent living skills, seeking employment, personal care, health appointments and medication administration.

Service User Involvement:

• Service users are involved in planning their own support, weekly house meetings are conducted alongside individual Key Worker meetings to give people the opportunity to share their ideas and wishes.

Rehabilitation Schedules, Social Activities, and Activities of Daily Living:

• Social activities are offered in the unit daily, as well as choices for individual activities. The people who use the service, complete planners or schedules to arrange their days and incorporate rehabilitation goals, appointments and leisure.

Clothing and Laundry:

• Individuals are encouraged and supported to complete their own laundry using the units facilities.

Mealtimes:

• Mealtimes are at the times chosen by the people the service supports, to offer a person centred approach.

Diet and Choice:

• Choices are offered for each meal, every day. Dietary requirements are taken into consideration per individual and alternatives offered e.g. low sugar, vegetarian options.

Bedrooms:

• Each bedroom is personalised, with an en-suite.

Access:

• The service is wheelchair accessible and has the use of a lift.

GP / Medical Cover:

• GP services are local to the unit, as well as the available 111 services for medical advice.

Staff Training:

• Comprehensive brain injury training, as well as mandatory training in other required domains regulated.

Fire Safety and Evacuation Planning:

• The service is undergoing work to install sprinkler systems in the unit to add additional fire safety. Evacuation plans are held within the service and regular evacuation drills take place.
